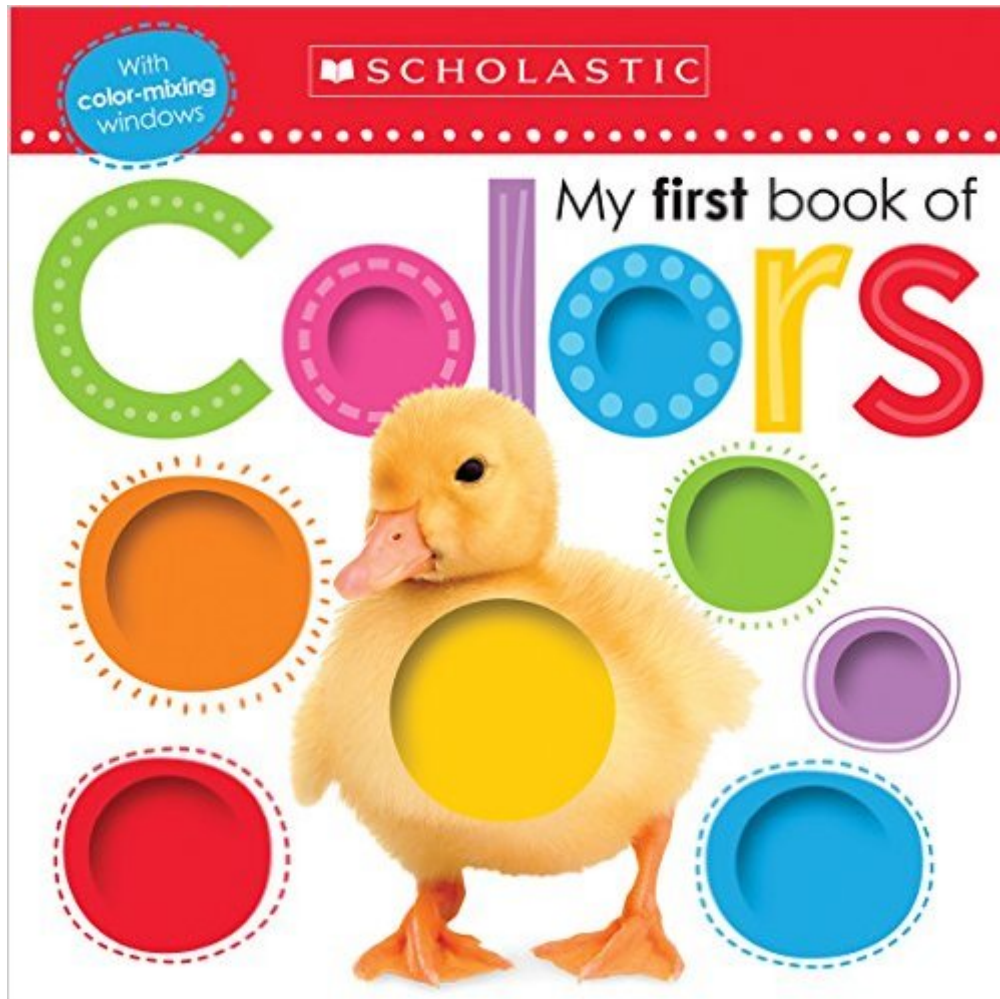

I had high expectations on this book. The idea of color mixing windows is awesome, I'm sure it will be mind blowing for a young child, except one problem: There's too many repeated primary colors. With 14 pages, your child get to learn about the three primary colors and three secondary colors. I understand the writer was trying to balance out the color pages so the color mixing windows would work, but some repeated colors pages are not necessary, they could have been replaced with neutral colors like white, black or grey. It's kind of annoying to see red, yellow, and blue two or three times within the limited 14 pages. If possible, I wish it would introduce brown too. But let's be

fair. For a price lower than \$5, the book served its purpose as an introduction of color mixing. I haven't seen any other book transfer color mixing better than this one.
