

This book is cute but very wordy and too advanced for my 3 year old. I bought this based on a recommendation I read online. For each tree, there is a picture on one page and a full page of text on the other describing the tree. This was too much for my son. The artwork is nice but it's a little abstract for the text detail, so that my son couldn't recognize the "chocolate tree" as an example, even though he knows what the cacao pod looks like. It's not really bedtime reading or a story but may be good in a classroom setting for elementary school kids.
